**Subtheme:** In Ns first further issues with regard to marriage are clarified then further criticism to behaviour of hypocrites and Bani Israel takes place. In Md mostly rules of edibles (particularly those that were made complicated directly or indirectly by the Jews or polytheists) are further clarified.

Main Addressees: Bani Ishmael of the time

**Objective:** Establishing and clarifying some of the rules of religion (Sharia) for the new nation of God and separating them from non-believers and their practices

Al-Nisa: 163 – 176; Al-Ma'ida: 109 - 120 Subject: The Messengers and the nations of God Subtheme: Emphasis on the role of Messengers and the destiny of the nations who receive Messengers

Main Addressees: Bani Ishmael of the time

**Objective:** To emphasize on the covenant of the Almighty with the chosen nations

when a Messenger is sent to them

**Note:** In Ns Bani Ismael are reminded about the covenant of God with them while there is another warning to Christians of the time. The chapter ends with a further clarification on the rules of inheritance that was needed at the time. In Md the example of Jesus and his disciples and followers is given as a warning to Christians of the time and a lesson to Bani Ishmael

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
